Dr. Pickering, who is director of Caltech's Jet Propulsion Laboratory, is also a member of the National Academy of Sciences committee in charge of the satellite that will be launched during the coming International Geophysical Year. A Caltech alumnus (BS '32, MS '33, PhD '36), and a former member of the Caltech faculty (professor of electrical engineering), Dr. Pickering became head of JPL in 1954.
