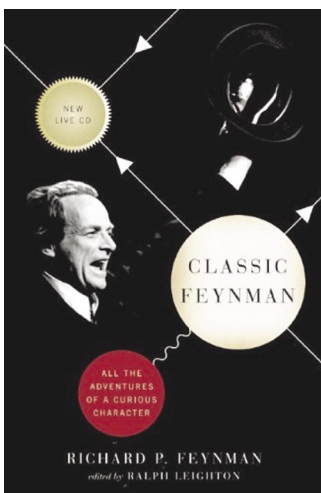
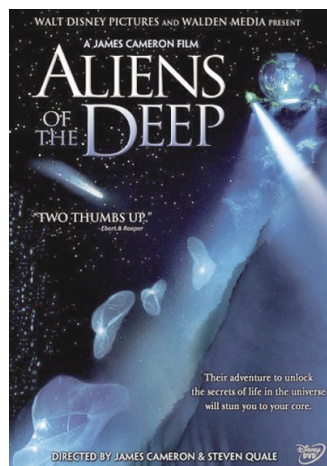


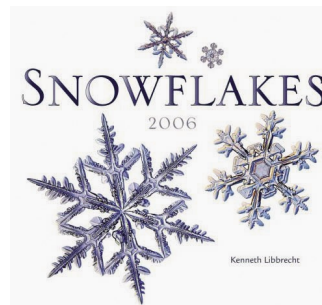
You read the article in *E&S* (number 4, 2004), but you didn't get to see the 3-D IMAX movie? Bummer!
