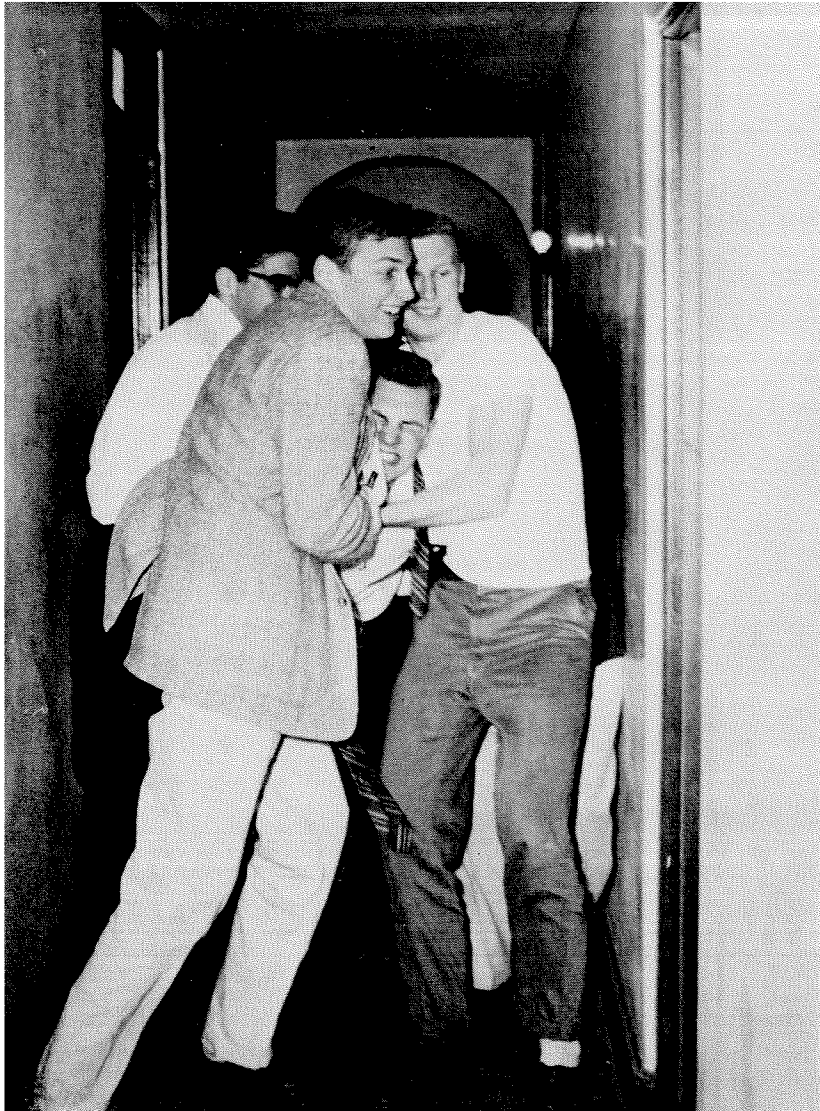


Voters and Visitors
