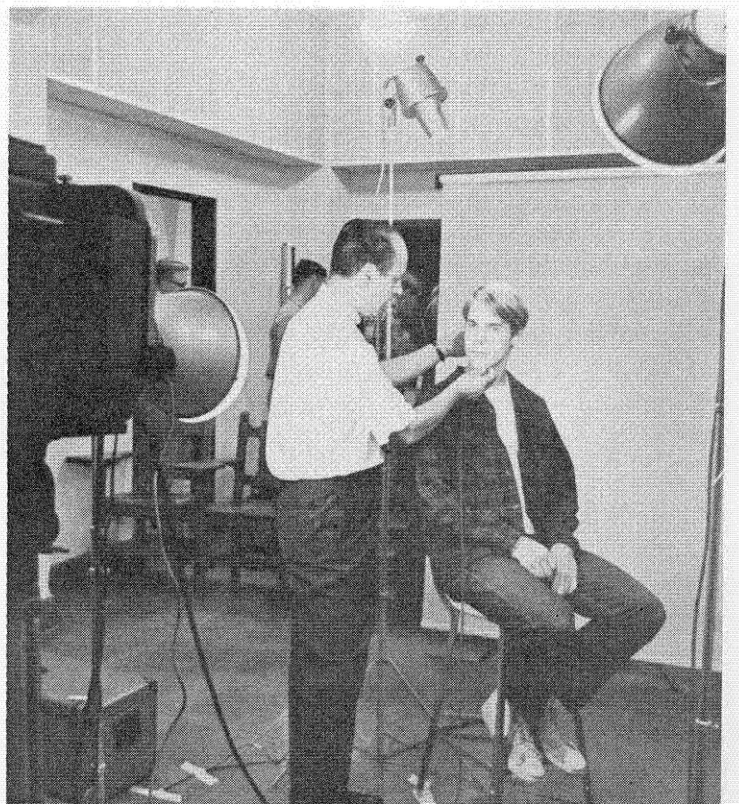
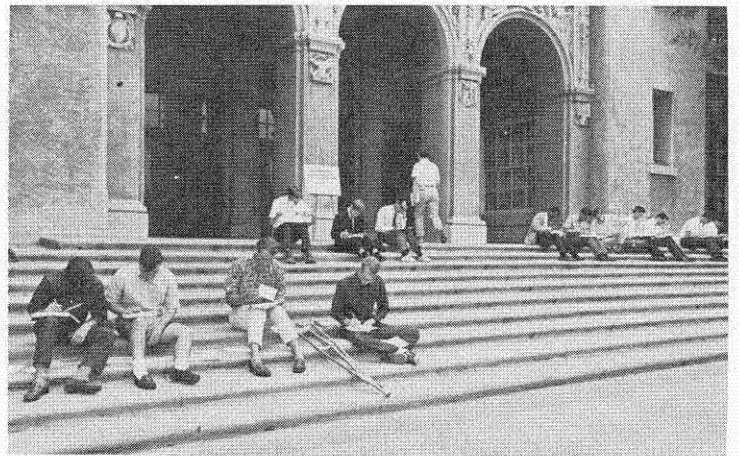
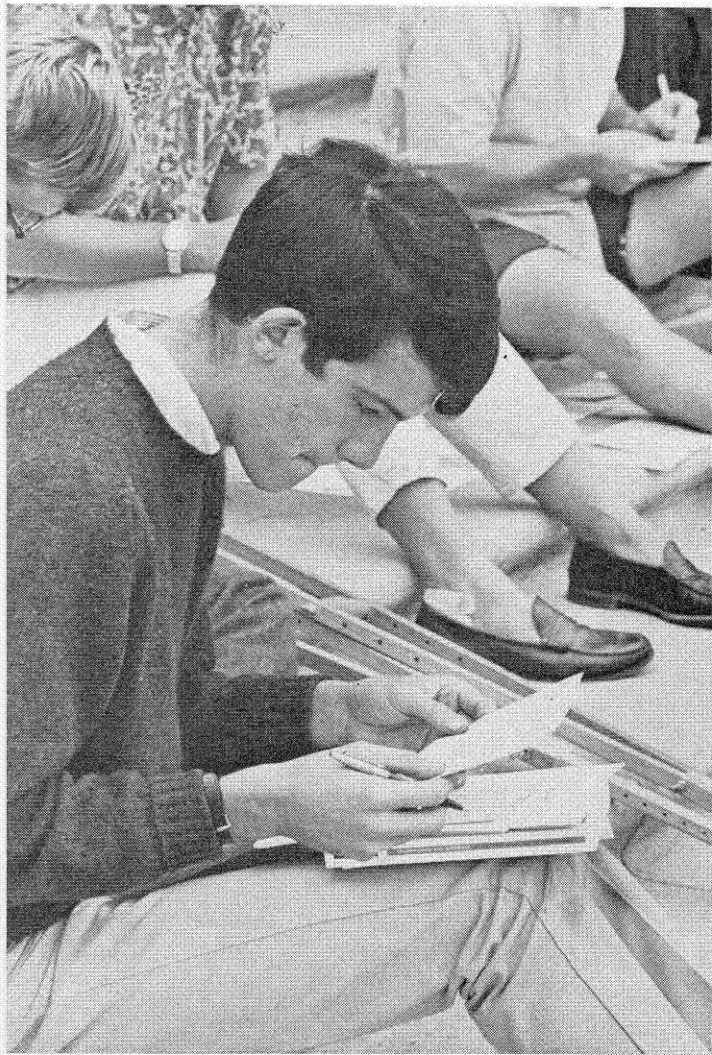
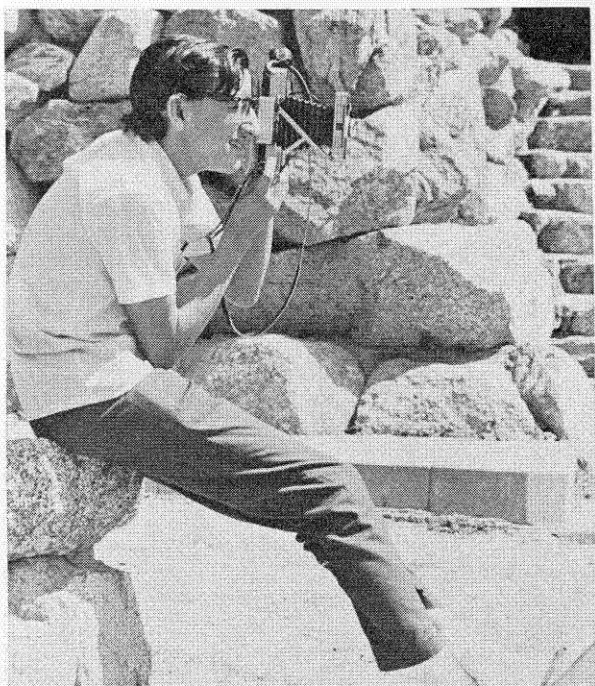
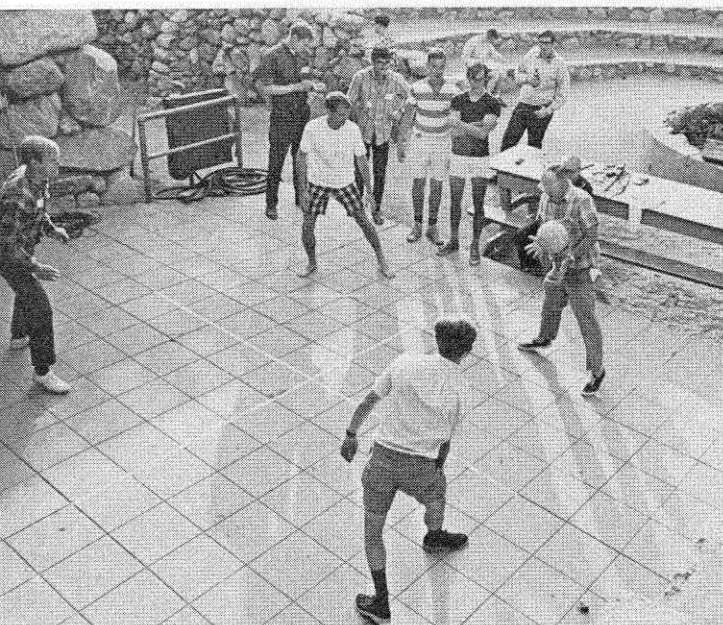
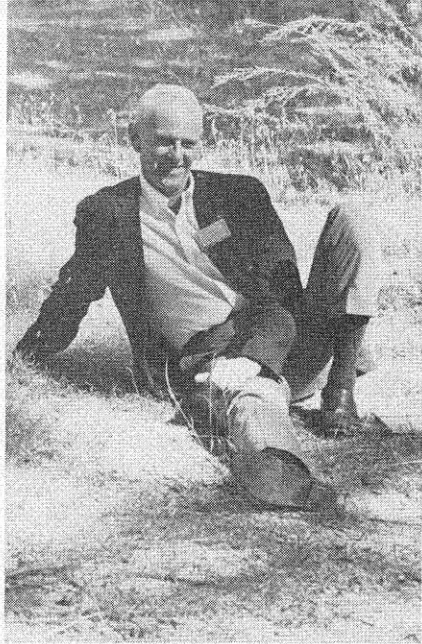


**THE
